## Investment objective

The Fund aims to provide long term capital growth.



## Investment strategy

The Fund is actively managed and does not track a benchmark.

The Fund will invest in range of instruments which may include, but are not limited to: shares and bonds, funds and other transferable securities. The Fund has the flexibility to allocate investments between these asset classes.

The Fund may invest in: shares including common stocks and other transferable securities in companies of any size that are listed or traded on recognised markets worldwide; investment grade, below investment grade and unrated bonds which can have fixed or floating rates.

The Fund may invest Sukuk and in bonds issued by the Islamic Liquidity Management

Corporation (ILMC), governments, government-related entities and companies in emerging market countries and denominated in the currencies of emerging market countries

The Fund may invest up to 100% in shares of Shariah compliant funds, including exchange traded funds, with up to 20% in a single fund. The Fund may invest substantially in emerging market countries and up to 10% of its NAV in cash.

The Fund will maintain adherence to Shariah principles as interpreted by the Shariah Committee and advised to the Investment Manager and the Management Company.

## Main risks

- The Fund invests in bonds whose value generally falls when interest rates rise. This risk is typically greater the longer the maturity of a bond investment and the higher its credit quality. The issuers of certain bonds, could become unwilling or unable to make payments on their bonds and default. Bonds that are in default may become hard to sell or worthless.

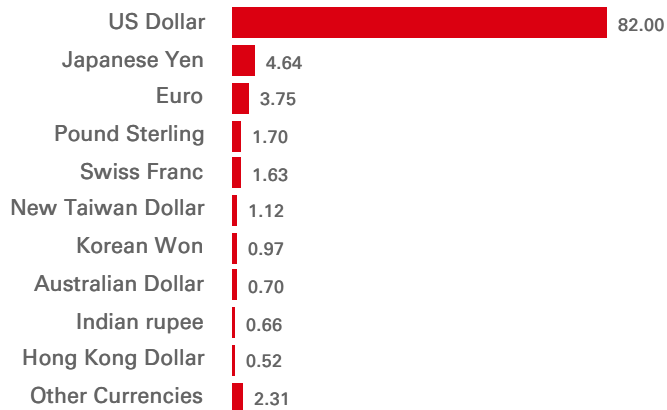

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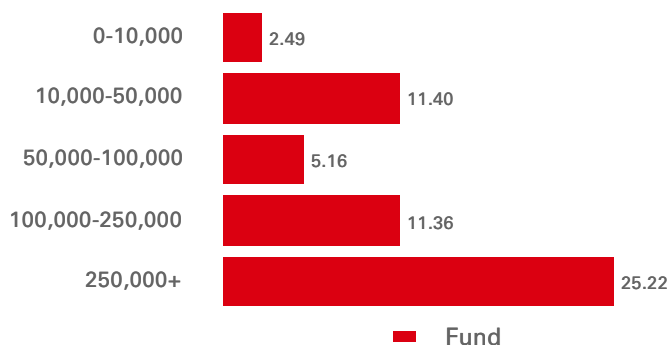
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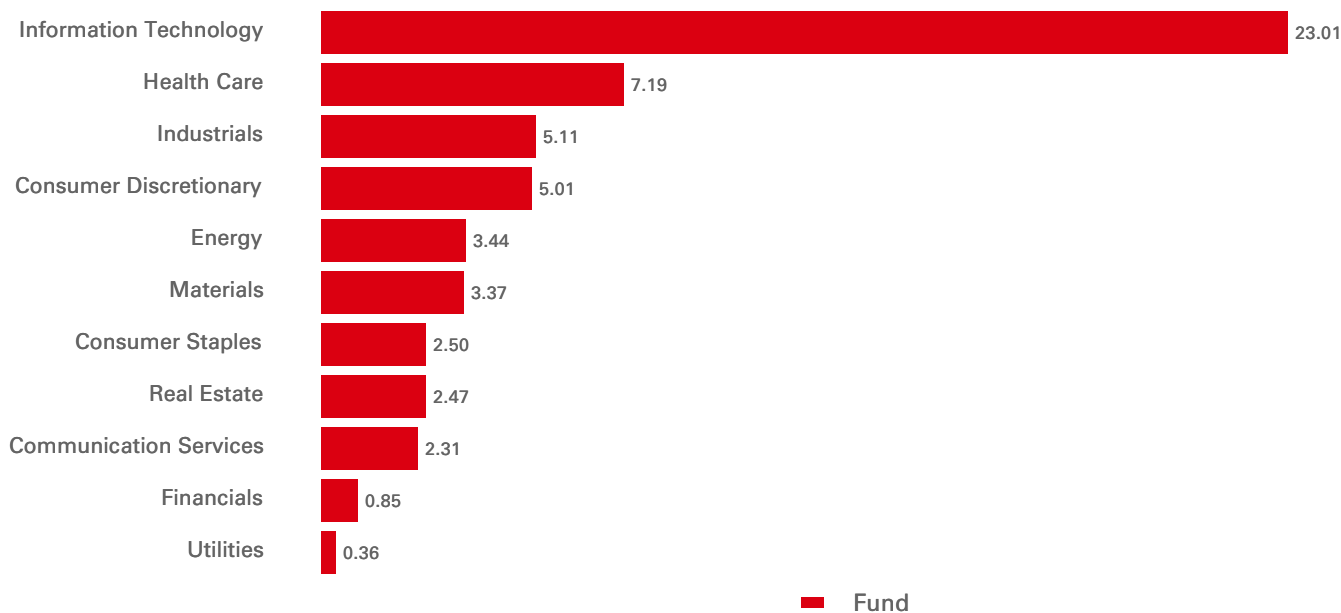

Market cap allocation (USD Mil %)

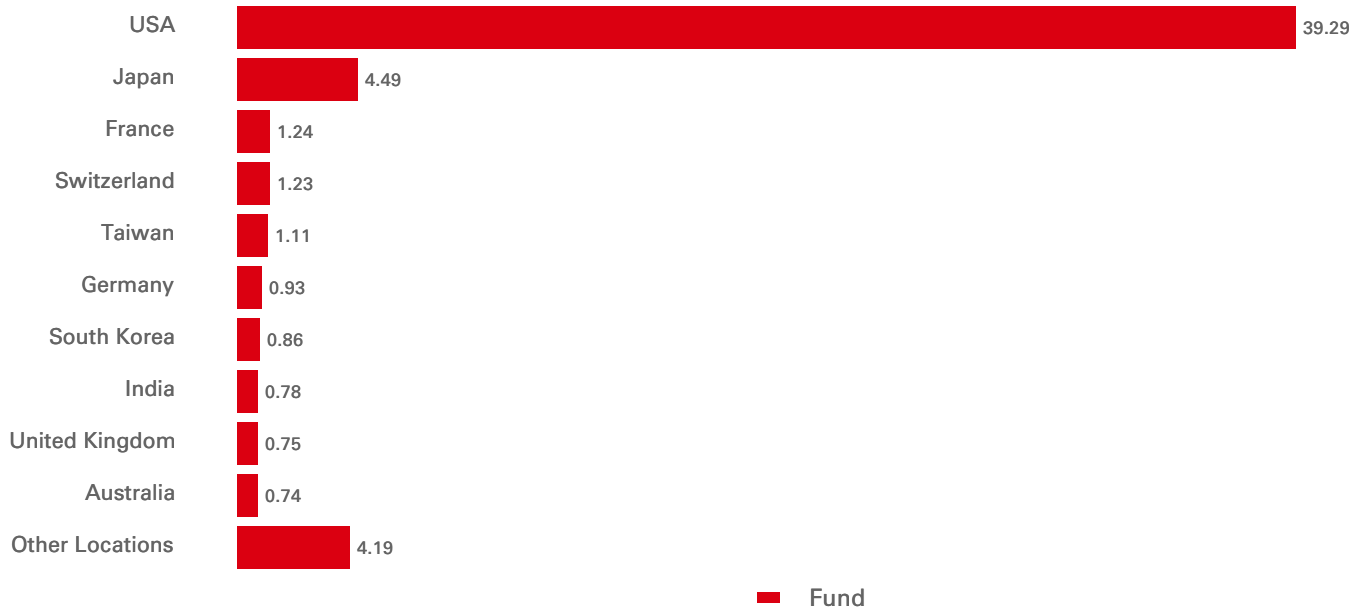


Equity sector allocation (%)

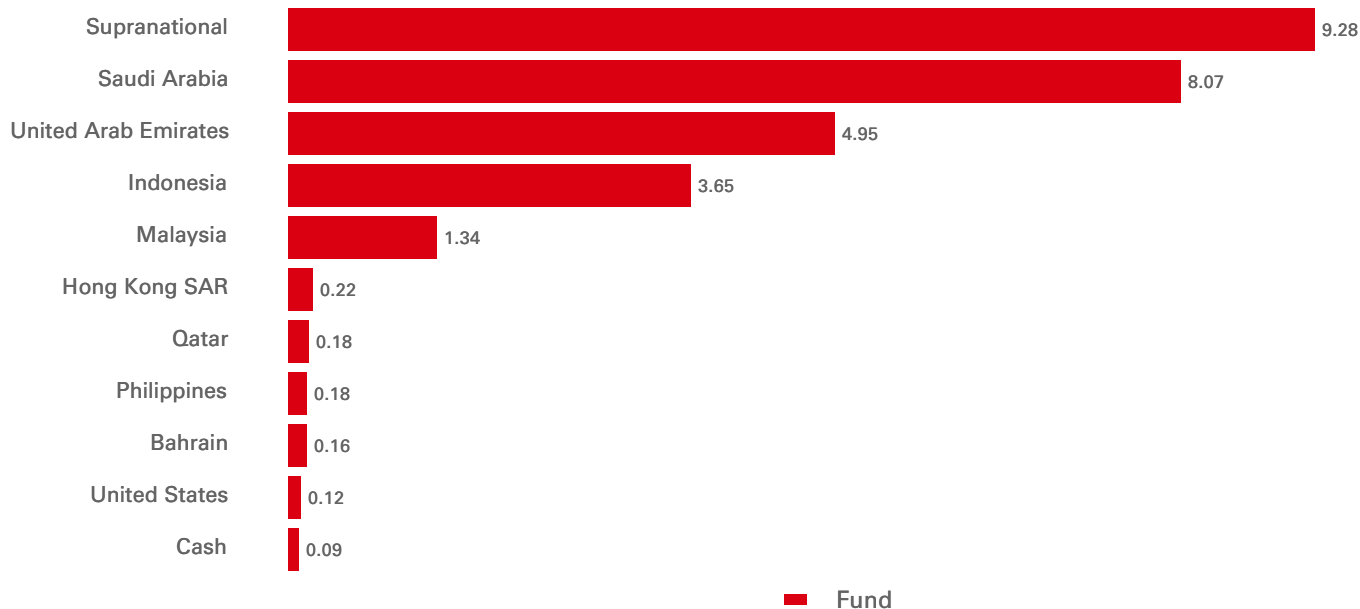

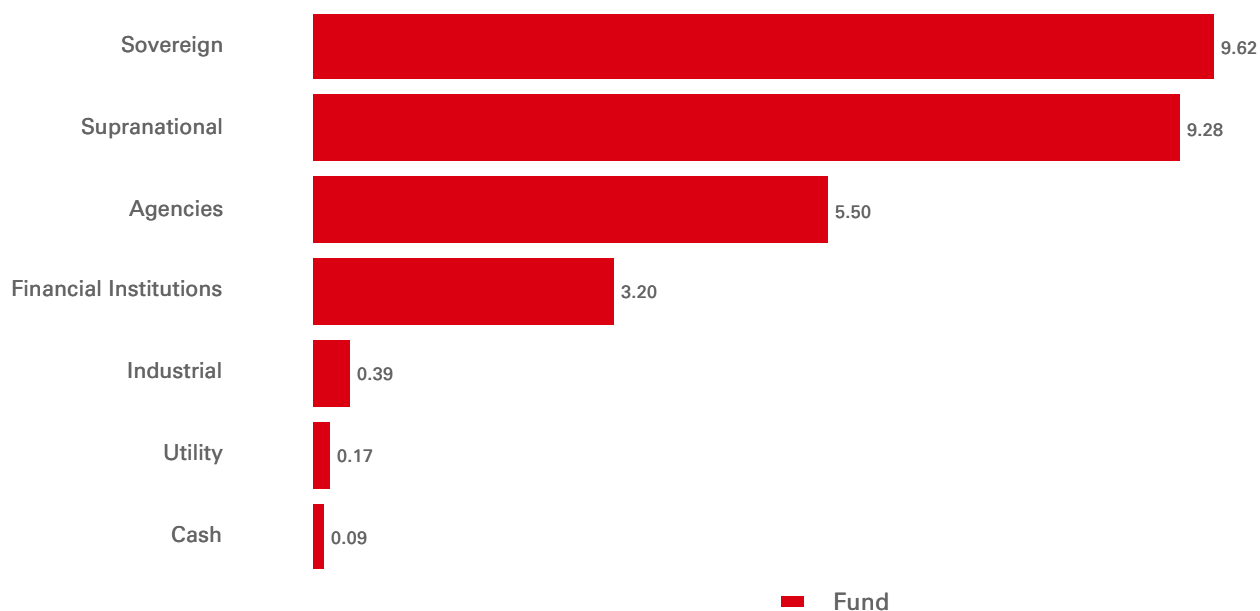

## Monthly performance commentary

### Portfolio performance

Equities rallied in February, while government bonds fell modestly. This resulted in a positive return for the Shariah Multi Asset fund. The portfolio is actively positioned against a long-term strategic asset allocation. During February, the biggest negative contribution came from our tilt away from equity. Conversely, our tilt away from Property and gold position added value.

### Investment Team Views and Portfolio Positioning

There are three key themes that we are positioned to capture within the Shariah Multi Asset fund:

**Recession concerns easing** - The likelihood of a recession in the West has fallen, with the US economy looking particularly strong; providing support for equity markets. However, economic growth is still slowing, and as such we remain selective in our equity holdings. We are still tilted away from Property, as we believe the full impact of higher borrowing costs has yet to be priced in.

**The rate cuts are coming** - In our view, the major central banks are likely to start cutting interest rates in the second half of 2024 as inflation continues to ease and economic growth slows. This encourages us back into bonds, which are (for the first time in almost a decade) delivering an appealing stream of income for investors.

**Outperformance in Eastern markets** - The economic backdrop in markets such as Japan is very strong, monetary policy settings are accommodative and there is room for fiscal support. The portfolio is tilted towards Japan versus developed market equity given attractive valuations, strong flows from foreign investors, improved corporate governance, and a weakening Yen supporting exports.
